What an interesting last quarter! As some of you know I had knee surgery in August, in the midst of my recovery Alexandria discovered she needed her tonsils removed. No small ask for an adult. After getting back on my feet so to speak I started to have trouble catching my breath walking down my street. A LOOOONNNNGGG ER visit and appointments with my cardiologist later I found out I had blockage. In November they attempted to place a stent, however they quickly discovered I would need to receive some bypasses. On December 9th I went into Providence for a quadruple bypass and by all accounts it was very successful. The recovery process for a 70+ year old is a bit more than I anticipated. After 8 days in the ICU and another 5 in

the step down unit I was able to go to the rehab center (hopefully by the time you are reading this I am soon to be on my way home) I was really upset when the realization kicked in that I would be in the hospital or rehab center during Christmas, but my family pulled through again!

The last time I had a terrible Christmas away from family was when my reserve unit was activated during the Vietnam war. When I expressed my anxiety I was informed that plans were already in the works to make sure that this Christmas was not even a runner up for worst Christmas.

Once I was out of the ICU my Tim, Alexandria, Arabella, and Amelia all came with dinner and decoration. We didn't quite deck the halls but my room was definitely decked out. With a mini Christmas tree, window clings, Christmas cards, and a sound machine projector my room was the talk amongst the staff. It really did help to chase those holiday blues away.

I look to the new year with hope and optimism knowing family is always here for me no matter what life throws at me.

his path would surely agree. He was in the Air Force for four years with Miliary Police. He graduated from TCU and retired from the District Attorney's Office in Fort Worth. He was remembered in the Canyons for rescuing a Great Pyrenees and she had two litters of pups. Several of the puppies went to a Great Pyrenees rescue in Houston. My love for my Father was unconditional.
